Section 1. The City of Wheeling, WV is a participating local government in various opioidrelated claims which were submitted to the jurisdiction of a panel overseeing the mass litigation proceeding captioned *In Re. (Opioid Litigation, Civil Action No. 21-C-9000 (W.Va. Cir.Ct. Kanawha County)*

Section 2. The City of Wheeling, WV was apportioned a share of the WV MLP Opioid Settlement Funds.

Section 3. The Legal Department of the City of Wheeling, WV believes the uses proposed by its Fire Department are within the criteria as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding controlling the agreed use of the opioid settlement funds. *See:* The Legal Department Memorandum attached and incorporated herein.

Section 4. The City of Wheeling Fire Department has provided the purpose, background and associated costs for the proposed opioid abatement expenditures of Four Hundred Thirty-One Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-Three dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$431,833.69). *See*: The Fire Department's supporting documentation attached and incorporated herein. Such expenditures are to ensure appropriate resources for law enforcement to engage in enforcement and possess adequate equipment, tools and manpower to address the complexity of the opioid problem. *See generally:* Approved uses Opioid Settlement Funds-Exhibit A to West Virginia First Memorandum of Understanding; Schedule A- Core Strategies & Schedule B-Approved Uses. Specific Portions of which are included in the City Legal Department's Memorandum attached and incorporated herein.

By the Administration



Mr Herron,

I read through the opioid settlement guidelines for spending and have come up with several ideas for the Fire Department.

- CPR training equipment, and Narcan administration training equipment. This equipment would include CPR mannequins, AED trainers, Airway management training equipment, and Narcan administration training equipment. \$4,554.00
- Controlled substance securing devices for our ambulances and EMS supply storage areas. This would allow us to better secure and track the controlled substances that we carry on our ambulances for patient treatment. \$15,814.00
- Automated CPR devices. The Auto Pulse is device that is applied to folks in cardiac arrest and performs CPR hands free allowing crews to further treat patient and allows for safety of personnel while travelling to the hospital. 5 units with service agreement \$154,219.45
- Power stair chairs. Stair chairs are used to move incapacitated individuals safely from a confined area and up and down stairs. These power stair chairs provide safety from back injuries for our responders who are often moving patients from precarious areas. 3 units with service agreement = \$64,714.55.
- **Disinfecting equipment for Ambulances.** These devices allow for a disinfecting solution to be released in a closed ambulance. The material dries without residue and helps protect crews as well as future patients from the spread of communicable diseases. 4 units @ \$63,766.16.
- Automatic External defibrillators. AED's are used to determine if an incapacitated patient is in need of heart defibrillation. These devices are carried on all WFD vehicles so that capability is available as soon as WFD is on scene. We currently have 15 units that are at end of life and in need of replacement. 18 AED's with service agreements =\$89,441.46

- Ballistic Vests for Responders. In the current climate in our nation, first responders are subject to violence aimed at them while responding. Often in overdose situations the patients are located in questionable locations which puts our responders at risk. 32 vests @ \$29,035.52
- EMS slide in attachment for UTV: This would allow us to use a current UTV to transport a incapacitated victim from a hard to reach area (example homeless camp emergencies) \$10,289
- Grand Total \$431,833.69

1. Funding for law enforcement efforts to curtail the sale, distribution, promotion or use of opioids and other drugs to reduce the oversupply of licit and illicit opioids, including regional jail fees.

J. RESEARCH

Research to ameliorate the opioid epidemic and to identify new tools to reduce and address opioid addiction... Ensure tools exist to provide law enforcement with appropriate enforcement to address needs.

H.PREVENT OVERDOSE DEATHS AND OTHER OPIOID-RELATED INJURIES

1. FIRST RESPONDERS

In addition to items in Section C, D and H relating to first responders, support the following:

1. Educate law enforcement or other first responders regarding appropriate practices and precautions when dealing with fentanyl or other drugs.

Statewide, regional, local or community regional planning to identify root causes of addiction and overdose, goals for reducing negative outcomes related to the opioid epidemic, and areas and populations with the greatest needs for treatment intervention services, and to support training and technical assistance and other strategies to abate the opioid epidemic described in this opioid abatement strategy list.
- 2. Invest in infrastructure or staffing at government, law enforcement, or not-forprofit agencies to support collaborative, cross-system coordination with the purpose of reducing the oversupply of opioids, preventing overprescribing, opioid misuse, or opioid overdoses, treating those with OUD and any cooccurring SUD/MH conditions, supporting them in treatment or recovery, connecting them to care, or implementing other strategies to abate the opioid epidemic described in this opioid abatement strategy list.
- 3. Provide resources to staff government oversight and management of opioid abatement programs.

K. TRAINING

1. Provide funding for staff training, services to improve the capability of government, law enforcement, entities to abate the opioid crisis.

M. LAW ENFORCEMENT
