#### PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Okay. The last item on the agenda is the Special Area Plan application -- or Special Area Plan to the Comprehensive Plan Amendment. That was mouth full, wasn't it?

Before I open this up, I just have a few comments.

than 200 wheeling citizens who rendered e-mails, opinions, expert facts and data, the transcribed proceedings was very helpful, second opinions from experts in the field who live in wheeling and who referred us to expert documents on dust and habitats and numerous other things, people who wrote articles in the Wheeling News Register and the Intel, the paper, itself, their editorials, and they followed us for more than a year -- I don't know how long it's been -- 14 months and stuck with us. In my opinion, this is democracy at its best, and we appreciate all those people and hope you continue to be active in public service and visit the Wheeling Planning Commission meetings and keep us informed and abreast of the issues that need to be addressed in our City.

We are here tonight to consider whether the designated area, Woodsdale hill, which has been determined

to be a conservation development area by Wheeling City Council when they approved the Comprehensive Plan is the best use of that property or whether the proposal that we have before us better reflects the community vision established in the 2000 Comprehensive Plan than the original recommendations of the comprehensive district.

So that's our task here tonight. We're going to do that through all the information, e-mails we have received, and analyze the benefits and impact of the proposal before us and the current designation in the Comprehensive Plan of a conservation development area.

With that said, Commissioners, I open it up to you for discussion. Go ahead.

COMMISSIONER MONROE: I have a couple comments.

First of all, I concur with everything you said and add an especially large thank you to the staff, Tom Connelly. The amount of work that has gone into this is more than I've seen in the many years -- you and I, Mr. Mauck, have been here many years and some say too many, but that's a whole different issue. But the amount of work that went into this to gather the information, to put it into a spreadsheet that we could read, to prepare a very well-done lengthy explanation in our staff report so we could follow along is deserving of tremendous credit.

Tom, I appreciate the work that you did, in particular, on this. I really want to thank you for it. It's helped me to think my way through some of this, although much of it was akin to what I was thinking.

A couple of things that I want to say before we get to a vote, whichever way we're going to vote, and some of these are the "I do nots."

I do not think Mr. Coyne and Mr. Grayson are some kind of nefarious schemers trying to destroy our community. I do not believe that. I think they are legitimate developers who want to make use of property they have and they believe what's best for the City. I reject the arguments that they are bad people.

I do not think -- despite all of the e-mails that we received and some of the indications in the geological studies, I do not think that we can automatically assume that water runoff will become worse with this, because I do believe that this would lead to a managed form of water runoff and stormwater management and so on. Therefore, I think it is possible to get better.

I do not think Woodsdale deserves any special consideration above and beyond that which we give to any other neighborhood. And if there's anything that -- with due respect to those who wrote about the passion they

feel, "but this is Woodsdale" bothered me along the way. I give serious consideration to all these decisions, no matter what neighborhood it might be in.

I would also say I do not think it is our responsibility or frankly even our ability to determine if there is a need for more restaurants or another Highlands. I just think it's outside our realm of expertise and frankly outside of our charter, if you will.

But there are things that I am concerned about.

I am concerned about the impact of the actual earth-moving construction over many years, the impact of that on the entire area there surrounding the project.

I am and have been since Day 1 several years ago when this first came to us had a concern about traffic access. It is a highly constrained access right now. Can the access be improved? Perhaps. Will it be? I'm not sure I've seen signs it will be for sure. We did see some good traffic -- I thought some good proposals in this plan that we have, but I yet to hear either side saying they are going to pay for it, and that concerns me greatly.

As our staff member Mr. Connelly outlines in his report, Comprehensive Plan Mission No. 6 is talking about improving the quality of life, and I think that may be the centerpiece of what we have to look at here.

So we are an entity that is concerned with the land use. We are not a development agency. I have said since the day I got on this commission 20 years ago guardians of the Comprehensive Plan. I have shepherded two comprehensive plans through this process over those years, and so I believe that the previous plans -- and this one, a lot of thought and effort went into preparing it. These were not capricious decisions that were made.

So the big question is, as Mr. Connelly says: Is there sufficient evidence to change the Comprehensive Plan? I think this may be the right idea, but I think it's the wrong place. There is just not an overwhelming rationale in my mind for us to change our Comprehensive Plan.

I have wrestled with this. Some folks, I sensed, began with a preconceived notion. I did not. I have spent an awful lot of time reviewing all of the documents and trying to find -- as I always do, trying to find a third way. I cannot find a third way. I just don't see another way.

I wanted to get some of my -- I think some of what we heard were unfair disparagements upon the developers, and I do not want to see that. I do not concur with that.

I think in the end the question is: Is there 2 sufficient evidence to change our Comprehensive Plan? For 3 a couple of reasons I mentioned there and more importantly for the lengthy reasons mentioned in the staff report, I 4 don't think there are. 5 CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Thank you, Commissioner, 6 7 Monroe. Other comments? Questions? 8 9 (No response) CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Seeing none, we will 10 entertain a motion if you're ready. 11 COMMISSIONER WRIGHT: I'll make the motion that 12 the Special Area Plan not be granted. There will be no 13 amendment to the Comprehensive Plan. 14 COMMISSIONER MONROE: I would second that. 15 CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Moved by Martha Wright and 16 17 seconded by Howard Monroe. Additional comments? 18 19 (No response) 20 CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Okay. Commissioners, we have a motion to deny the Special Area Plan and the 21 amendment to the Comprehensive Plan. Push the button yes 22

if you agree with denial, no if you agree to approve.

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(Electronic vote taken)

CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: We have an eight to zero 2 for denying the Special Area Plan. 3 Do you have any additional comments, Mr. Connelly? 4 MR. CONNELLY: This will also appear in our 5 report to council for the first week of November. 6 CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Okay. Thank you. 8 COMMISSIONER PALMER: To be clear, 9 Mr. Connelly, council will take no action since there was no action taken here tonight? There will be no action 10 11 taken by council; is that correct? 12 MR. CONNELLY: Other than accepting the report. 13 COMMISSIONER PALMER: Okay. Thank you. 14 CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Any comments for the good of the order? 15 COMMISSIONER MONROE: I just want to repeat 16 17 again, I want to commend the developers for having 18 presented a well thought-out proposal. I don't think it 19 meets the needs we looked at, but I thought it was a well thought-out proposal. I think they were very good about 20 dealing with the concerns that were raised, and they 21 deserve credit for all that. 22 23 Again, I do want to say thanks to all of those 24 people that presented their point of view. I have never

wrestled as hard as with this. That's for sure.

CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Commissioner Monroe speaks for me and also speaks for the Commission.

COMMISSIONER MONROE: I just want to say thank you, sir, as you go away from the chairmanship. This has been a difficult year -- not difficult, but it's certainly been a busy year for you --

CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: It has.

COMMISSIONER MONROE: -- couple of years and you have shepherded this issue through with a tremendous amount of efficiency and equality and fairness, and I give you a huge amount of credit for that.

CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: Don't let that lay a burden on your shoulders.

The chair will entertain a motion to adjourn.

COMMISSIONER WEST: So moved.

CHAIRPERSON MAUCK: I'll second.
