Hi Mr. Connelly,

Thank you for serving on the Planning Committee on behalf of Wheeling's citizens, like myself.

As you consider the request for the special permit to allow hilltop removal by GC&P, please be aware that as a home owner and resident in Woodsdale I am extremely concerned about the impact of the proposal.

Of my multitude of concerns, the one I must convey with utmost importance is the health and safety of my child. A steady stream of construction vehicles on the roads that connect this neighborhood to our playgrounds, schools, medical facilities, and shopping areas will not only cause an immediate threat due to the increased traffic and increased noise and air pollution but also a long-term threat on account of compromised road quality from the heavy machinery and the effects of soil erosion not only on the economic value but also safety of our homes due to increased risk of flooding.
