### **MEMORANDUM**

**RE**: 2019-2020 Budget - Public Works

As Public Works Director for the City of Wheeling, my goal is to provide the same level of services or better to the citizens of the City of Wheeling by increasing efficiency and streamlining job functions wherever possible. This year I am again requesting that we establish a monthly Storm Water Fee to be included with the City of Wheeling's Water Bill. As I have stated before, it is time for us to establish a Storm Water Utility that is mandated by the WVDEP to fund the operation of the work that is necessary to operate a Storm Water Utility. The revenue generated from this fee will be used for sewer separation projects, personnel that will be needed to do inspections and storm water testing and to purchase all equipment that would maintain this system, including street sweepers. This program would also reduce the number of basement flooding's and prevent the icing on the street problems that we are facing in the winter months because there are no storm sewers in those areas.

We still have not addressed the bridge repair problems that we have with three of our bridges that are rated as poor condition by the WV State Bridge inspections. Last year I was asking for funding to repair the Washington Avenue Bridge, the Shilling Bridge in Elm Grove and the Baker Street Bridge at the peninsula. The Washington Avenue Bridge needs the anchor plates and bolts replaced, beam repairs made and rivets replaced. The Baker Street Bridge needs sidewalk and decking work completed. The Shilling Bridge needs beam and pier work. The State of WV just completed an inspection of the Washington Avenue Bridge and want these repairs made as soon as possible. This work cannot be performed in house and will have to be contracted out. This work will be a very expensive project in the hundreds of thousands of dollars.

We have a problem with the City of Wheeling Public Works 800MHz radio system. When the Police and Fire Departments updated and moved to a new radio system, Public Works was not included with the upgrade and stayed with the old system. This system is now over 20 years old and parts are no longer available to repair our repeater system. Bearcom, formerly Staley Communications, has exhausted all of their spare parts. Two of our four repeaters have failed. If one more repeater goes down we will lose our two way radio system. We have had ongoing problems with the system going into fail soft mode and constantly beeping. We are waiting for pricing from Bearcom.

The Courtland Avenue Pump Station is now due for an overhaul. The pumps need to be pulled and rebuilt with new bearings and impellers and the building needs to be removed. The pumps were designed to be outside pumps and the building is just concrete block that now is starting to crumble because of the moisture from the underground storage pit. These pumps empty the storm sewer system on Courtland Avenue. An estimate for this project would be \$175,000.

Another area of concern is the amount of road slippages that we are having because of the unusually wet seasons that we are experiencing. We currently have 3 piling walls out to bid. I have a list of 12 additional slips throughout the City that are going to need attention. We have 2 slips which will be very expensive to repair. One is on Kenny St which has our 30" water line under the street and the other is on Floral Drive which is going to require the replacement of the cul-de-sac and an additional drainage system for the underground spring that is feeding it. I would like to re-establish the retaining wall repair line item in the Operations budget so that we can address these slip areas.

From an equipment standpoint, We would like to replace the 1985 bucket truck that we have in the Operations Division. It will not pass the State Inspection and many of its parts are obsolete. We need to have two bucket trucks to do some of our in the air repairs of signals and lighting projects. We also would like to replace two of our Operations small dump trucks with two new four-wheel drive units. The ones we would replace would be a 1993 and 1997 model.

### DIVISION OF OPERATIONS Transmittal

The budget request for fiscal year 2019 - 2020 request a 5% increase in salaries. This is to keep employees in pace with inflation and the public sector. Other increases are to basic services as utilities, equipment, and area maintenance.

The Division of Operations strives to give the citizens of Wheeling good quality service's in a safe and timely manner. We look to improve our services every year within the budget allotted.

The following accomplishments were completed by the Division of Operations in calender year 2018, while keeping in line with our budgets.

- 1. Cleared out broken limbs and problem tree branches from street lights, city property, right-of-ways and recreational areas
- 2. Worked with AEP and WVDOT with emergency repairs to signal system
- 3. Continued removal of old fire box line and alarm cables, almost done
- 4 12 trees trimmed from street lighting and signage
- Over 2,800 feet of curbing painted and 1,000 feet of crosswalks painted or installed
- 6. 36 vehicle markings made and installed
- 7. 365 signs installed, 70 straightened and 230 repaired, replaced or removed
- 8. 403 signs manufactured on the computer system for Federal Regulations requiring better reflectivity
- 9. 18 road markings installed including crosswalks, turn arrows, stop, school, and slow on various city streets
- 10. 36 vandalized signs removed and recovered
- 11. Meter money collected for the Finance Department weekly
- 12. 69 parking meters installed or replaced
- 13. Repainted and rebuilt 260 parking meter casings
- 14. 310 parking meters repaired or unjammed

- 15. Continue doing inventory with a Tough Book Laptop Computer and all signs have been inventoried in accordance to Federal guidelines.
- 16. Sprayed approximately 50 acres with herbicides. This is made up of fence lines, road shoulders, brick alleys, gravel parking areas, baseball infields, mulched and rip rap areas and storage areas.

I am pleased to report to you our list of accomplishments for the past year and our goals and objectives for the upcoming fiscal year.

Over the past year we have;

- Continued the engine oil analysis program with Schaeffer Specialized Lubricants Company.
   Schaeffer uses WebScope internet reporting as the primary independent analysis lab, ensuring rapid access to data for all industrial and commercial customers at no extra charge. The sampling program is a preventive/predictive maintenance tool. This state-of-the-art oil analysis program is designed to optimize the use of superior quality lubricants.
- 2. Purchased and refurbished 9 used state road trucks, SUV's including a rubber tired wheel loader. The vehicles are meticulously gone over by our shop and distributed among the City departments including Vehicle Maintenance, Building Inspection, Police Department and Operations Departments. These used vehicle purchases are very economical (compared to buying new units), saving the city taxpayers thousands of dollars. Based on the state contract vehicle pricing, we have saved over \$260,000 just this year alone in new vehicle purchases. It is sensible to do so, and we appreciate the administration's support in these vehicles purchases.
- Purchased and received four pieces of much needed heavy equipment for the Operation's
  Department. This equipment consists of a new regenerative air street sweeper, a tractor with a
  mid-mount boom type flail mower, backhoe loader and a small excavator. The average age of
  the equipment we replaced was over twenty years old.
- 4. Worked in conjunction with the Operation's Department in completing the construction our multipurpose area right next to our body shop in what was an open storage area. The area was plagued with water drainage issues that would ice up during the winter months. The roof was full of holes and had moss growing on it. We were able to transition this unusable space into a useful work bay and storage area for our body shop facility.
- 5. Purchase a new 2019 Peterbilt 520 refuge truck for the Sanitation Department. This unit replaced a 2007 model that needed a new engine and numerous other repairs. The Peterbilt came in \$12,000 lower than the other bids submitted. The Peterbilt also exceeded the bid specifications with a higher horsepower engine, air disc brakes, Haulmaax heavy duty rear suspension, aluminum cab, aluminum fuel and air tanks to name a few. We started the

sanitation truck evolution process in 2009 updating to the heaver duty, tandem axle, and cab over design. When the fleet is completely updated we will then be able to install new packer bodies on the older trucks, (as they wear out), enabling us to run them for another 5 to 8 years or so. Packer bodies are around one third of the cost of a complete refuge truck and will save us a lot of money on future truck purchases.

- 6. With your help, we did an emergency purchase of a new backhoe for the Water Pollution Control Division. Walsh Equipment Company honored the Operations Department bid pricing from November 2017. Not only did they honor the bid price, they gave us a higher horse powered unit with a one foot deeper digging depth similar to their old 1998 model. This purchase enabled us to save the taxpayers thousands of dollars and receive the backhoe in a timely fashion.
- 7. Traded with the City of Martins Ferry a pickup truck in exchange for an Elgin Pelican Street Sweeper with only 6000 hrs. on it. Our shop has thoroughly refurbished this sweeper and have replaced one of the other sweepers with over 20,400 hrs. On it. The sweeper acquisition alone will save the city over \$200,000.00 in new sweeper purchases.
- 8. Organized our semiannual surplus auction making the city \$77,252.00.
- 9. Created specifications for the purchase of a new track excavator for the Water Department Distribution Division

Our Goals and objectives for the upcoming year are;

- To recommend the purchase of a new bucket truck for the Operations Department. The
  existing unit recently went down for major mechanical repairs. In addition to the repairs to
  the truck itself, the bucket and boom system will require multiply safety updates and repairs
  to pass the annual safety inspection as well. Due to the age of the truck (1985 model) many
  of the repair parts are obsolete or unavailable.
- 2. To recommend the purchase of two small four wheel drive dump trucks for the Operations Department. The trucks will replace well-worn 1993 & 1997 models respectively.
- 3. To recommend up fitting our oldest Mack garbage packer, (2010 model put in service in 2009) with a new packer body to extend the trucks lifespan for another 5 to 8 years. The average lifespan of a garbage packer body is between 8 and 10 years. The cost of a re-body is around \$69,000 compared to \$212,000 to \$220,000 for a complete refuge truck. This is part of the refuse truck evolution I mentioned earlier.
- 4. To replace our shop exhaust fume evacuation system as recommended by our safety director. This system was installed back in the mid-seventies and is in need of attention. The

blower box and motor assembly are weak and the piping needs updated to fit our newer vehicles exhaust pipes. This safety upgrade will help protect our employees from serious lung diseases such as COPD, cancer, emphysema and carbon monoxide poisoning. Further saving the city money in health related issues stemming from exhaust exposure.

- 5. Write specifications for a new track excavator, trailer and sewer cleaning machine for the Water Pollution Control Division.
- 6. To recertify our shop employees and certify the newer employees in the ASE program to keep them up to date with the latest technology and procedures in the automotive field.
- 7. Would like to work with the administration on finding a way to raise the base pay for our Senior Equipment Mechanics. Their job duties require them to do so much more than average private sector repair shops and dealerships. Most private sector shops and dealerships specialize in one brand and are limited to the repair and maintenance of those specific vehicles. Our Senior Equipment Mechanics have to perform repairs and maintenance to all of our fleet vehicles including light, medium and heavy duty trucks, tractors, road sweepers, garbage trucks to name a few. They are also required to perform auto body and paint work, welding and hydraulic repair. At any given time our Senior Equipment Mechanics are actually working in several different specialty fields at one time, such as a body repair, a welder or hydraulic repair and yet receive lower pay than most private sector shops and dealerships that have only workers that specialize in general auto repair only.
- 8. To continue to provide the best quality and efficient service to all the departments, municipalities and taxpayers that we serve.

Budget wise, we are fine with the exception of our line items # 001.4754.30.3123 which are new-replacement parts and 001.4754.30.3124- which is gas, oil and diesel fuel. Due to price increases and the higher cost of servicing and maintaining our mixed fleet, I would like to recommend for next fiscal year that we increase our line item # 001.4754.30.3123 to from \$220, 00.00 to \$320,000.00 to offset those increases. I would also recommend increasing line item# 001-4754-30-3124 from \$65,000.00 to \$75,000.00. We have not had an increase in these line items for several years.

Included is a copy of our vehicle history report for all the work performed by our shop for the 2018 calendar year.

We would appreciate your consideration regarding our capital outlay and budget requests.

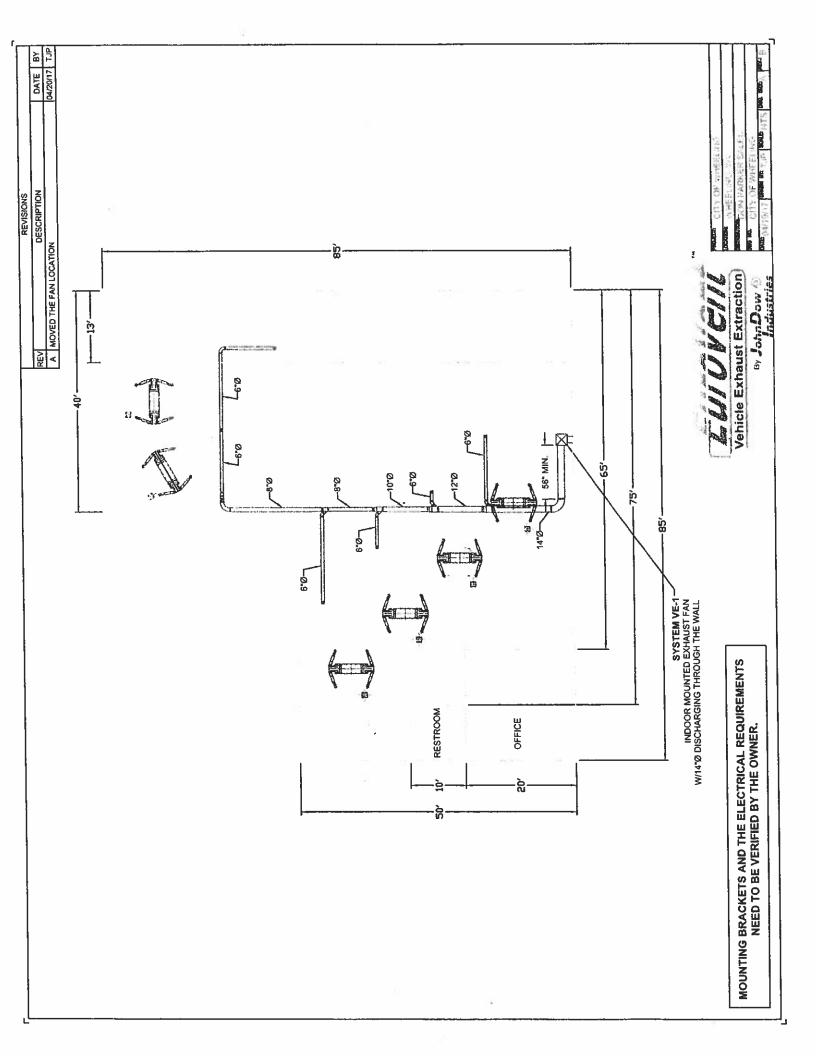

#### Dear Mr. Herron:

Attached for your review and approval is the proposed budget for fiscal year 2019-20 for the Engineering Department of the City of Wheeling. This proposed budget is about \$11,400 over the current one and I have proposed raises for both positions in the department.

Re: FY 2019-2020 Budget

The projects that have been completed or are under contract during this fiscal year total approximately \$2.66 million, and are shown on Attachment A. Once again I recommend establishing a bridge fund in order to have money available when a city bridge needs major rehabilitation or replacement. The Washington Avenue and the Homestead Avenue Bridges are rated in poor condition. The Baker Street and Schilling Bridges need work. I met with the DOH bridge inspectors this month and the bearings and numerous rivets and members need replaced on the Washington Ave Bridge. This work will cost a significant amount and the State is requesting that it be done as soon as possible. Maybe a bridge fund could be funded by setting aside a portion of the 1% additional sales tax.

In addition to all our projects, the Engineering Department provided technical assistance to the other Public Works Departments and also the Police and Fire Departments. We have provided maps and aerial photographs to assist in economic development, researched right of ways, reviewed plats and answered numerous questions and complaints from the public.

The goals are to complete all of the public works projects authorized by City Council and to continue to render specialized services to the other city departments as required.
