Subject FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 BUDGET

It is an honor to present the City of Wheeling Fire Department budget. In 2021 the Wheeling fire Department responded to 7,849 incidents. This was a record high number of incidents for a calendar year breaking the 2019 record high by 9%. Rescue and EMS calls accounted for 68% of the total call volume. Total incidents increased 14% from 2020.

Accomplishments:

- Awarded a FEMA AFG grant for 56 new self contained breathing apparatus
- Awarded a FEMA port authority grant for scuba diving equipment and training
- Took delivery of 2 new F450 4x4 ambulances
- Eight members of the Wheeling Fire Department recently completed Paramedic training and are preparing to sit for certification exam.
- A replacement for Engine 9 has been ordered that will serve the Warwood section of Wheeling. Delivery has been delayed due to supply chain issues but expect delivery in late 2022.
- Received the highest honor from the American Heart Association Mission Lifeline. The Gold Plus award for advanced cardiac care.
- Awaiting delivery of a new 4x4 pickup for our investigation division replacing a 2004 model in poor condition.
- Launching of Streetwise, allowing our responding units to get up to the minute information about buildings, hazards, traffic issues, fire hydrant locations etc on iPads that are mounted in each apparatus.

Training Division:

The Training Division processed 12 new recruits in 2021 with an additional 5 starting in January 2022 due to retirements. With the addition of the EMS Training Officer the training needs of the Wheeling Fire Department are more efficiently met. In addition to new recruit training, maintaining the skills of our current firefighters is very important. The availability of vacant buildings has allowed the training division to get priceless hands on training in buildings prior to demolition. The ever increasing requirements for continuing education for our EMT's and Paramedics also places demands upon the Training Division. The efforts of the Training Division keeps our members ready to face the challenges presented to keep our citizens and visitors safe. In addition training is provided to the public for CPR, First Aid, and Fire safety.

Investigation Bureau:

The Investigation Bureau investigates the causes of structural, vehicle, and outdoor fires. Fire cause determination is important to sometimes prevent future fires and to identify deliberately set fires. These investigators are highly trained in witness interviewing, evidence collection, and combing through debris to determine ignition sources and contributing factors to the fire. These officers are called upon to testify in court if necessary. In addition our investigators assist with background checks for new recruits as well as investigating small incidents that occur around the department.

Bureau of fire Prevention:

The Bureau of Fire Prevention helps protect the citizens of Wheeling by assuring that our public buildings meet life safety requirements either during construction or remodeling. Our inspectors meet with countless business owners, property managers, architects and construction managers to discuss what is needed for their specific occupancy. Services include plan reviews, construction inspections, license checks, fire extinguisher training, fire drills, alarm system tests, and fire safety lectures.

The Fire Safety House is a mobile fire safety classroom that normally reaches around 3,000 adults and children annually. Officers travel to the city's schools teaching lifesaving skills to protect themselves from a fire. With Covid restrictions our inspectors modified their training to allow for social distancing and still get the message to our youth. We are optimistic that community events will continue to return allowing us to reach more people in 2022.

EMT Coverage:

WFD provides EMT coverage for sporting events and festivals. These events tapered off in 2020 but have been steadily rising in 2021 and continuing into 2022. We look forward to the return of a full docket of events getting our community back to normal.

Goals and Objectives:

Breaking ground on the new Fire Headquarters at 17th and Wood street is anticipated for early spring. Countless hours of planning have went into this project. Thanks to council, city government, architects and our building committee for the dedication to this project.

Existing Fire station upgrades are also on the radar. Prioritization of repairs has been established first to start with structural issues at two of the stations, then roof issues, HVAC, and upgrades to kitchens and bathrooms

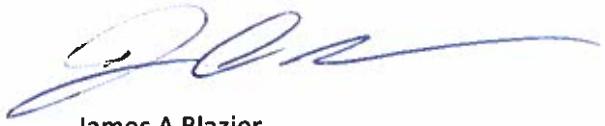
Other goals would be to replace our aging heavy rescue vehicle. The current rig can continue to serve in a reserve status but has started to require more frequent repairs due to it's age. Also replacing some outdated rescue equipment that we carry for auto extrication and special rescue situations.

We are also in need of updating our light vehicle fleet. If we can replace our Duty Chief vehicle that will allow us to transfer that vehicle to a lower frequency use division and allow us to remove a vehicle from the fleet that is in poor condition. The Training Division is also in need of a new vehicle. A crew cab pickup would allow them to transport recruits and tow trailers of equipment or boats the WFD need for incident management. The current Training vehicle is a 2002 Chevy Suburban.

Conclusion:

The men and woman of the Wheeling Fire Department are looking forward to the challenges and rewards 2022 will bring. In 2021 we lost nearly 300 years of collective experience at the WFD. Many of our younger firefighters have been thrust into leadership roles and I am proud to say they are up for the challenge. While I understand our requests are costly we hope that some of our projects may fall under the umbrella of the rescue act enabling the city to boost our facilities and equipment taking us into the future. With continued support of city government supplying the tools needed, we are poised to protect, serve, and educate the citizens of Wheeling , West Virginia.

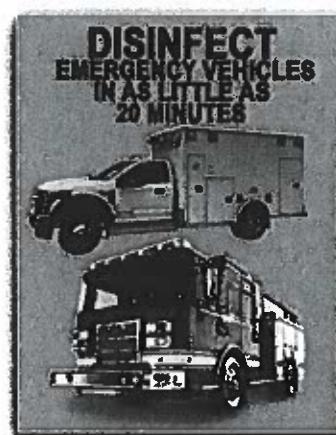
