

Fiscal 2020-21 Budget Submission

I am submitting the FY 2020-21 budget proposal for the Wheeling Police Department. Once again, this proposal will include minimal changes from the previous Police budget, except for some additional capital outlays that involve operational components. The bulk of the increase in this year's proposal is the recommended five percent (5%) pay increase for police employees. Recruitment and retention has become one of the biggest challenges for the Wheeling Police Department as well as the profession overall. In 2020, I will continue to explore ways to attract and retain quality employees while assuring that their contributions are compensated within the police department. We remain at seven vacancies as of this budget submission, with four of our sworn positions in varying levels of training and not yet certified, functional officers. This budget will recommend the 5% pay increase, but future proposals will be presented related to pay/fringe benefits for Wheeling Police officers. This budget submission will outline the year in review, moving forward and attempt to justify the operational line-item increases and capital outlays.

The crime statistics of the WPD were released recently. I take pride in our efforts and was happy to report that our Group A offenses were down 6.5% from the previous year and 15% over the last three years. Specifically in the Group A category, Robbery was down 33%, Burglary down 10%, and Street Level Drug offenses were down 27%. Group B offenses increased again. This coincides with our philosophy of directing patrols to high volume areas based on data and citizen complaints, thus addressing the offenders at a "lower level" before they commit higher level offenses. Our calls for service have dropped again this year and are attributed to our number of vacancies. The more officers working the streets, the more officer initiated activities can occur. Another challenge for the Wheeling Police Department is the illegal narcotic market. Unfortunately, our area is full of demand, while we continue to battle the supply. Our overdose data showed an increase again this year although our overdose deaths are down for now. It will be interesting to see if the reduction in street level drug offenses correlates to a reduction in overdoses finally in the coming calendar year. Yet another challenge we face is the Interstate 70 Bridge project. Despite issuing 3.7% more traffic citations last year, we saw an increase in traffic crashes. This is attributed to the rise in crashes in our construction zones and detour routes. We will continue to monitor this and address where we can with education, visibility and enforcement.

I remain proud of the Wheeling Police Department and our continued successes. We achieved much again in 2019. I prefer to focus on the individual efforts and wish to commend our Officer of the Year in 2018, PFC Kevin Kuca, as well as the Officers of each Quarter in

2019. We will be selecting our 2019 Officer of the Year in the coming weeks. Individual performance drives our success, and the reduction in key crime areas is a direct result of their efforts.

Departmentally, we have many successes as well. Our False Alarm Program continues to see reductions of our false alarms. We successfully handled multiple events such as the POTUS visit to Wheeling, the MEC Tournament hosted by Wheeling, and the many parades and other festivals held throughout the year. On the community policing front, we partnered with Ziegenfelders and conducted bicycle rodeos and "Pops with Cops" events, graduated another Citizens Police Academy, and had very successful events with our Safety Town and National Night Out participation. We have partnered with Ohio County EMA and Youth Services to roll out an Overdose Alert program and from our Strategic Plan have successfully implemented the very first Police Explorer Program. We have also been awarded a federal grant to hire and institute a victim advocate program. Operationally, we acquired and took ownership of our new SWAT vehicle, continued advanced training of our supervisors in Incident Command and managing complex events, as well continuing to secure outside funding for equipment needs thanks to a very generous and repeated donation from a local foundation.

Looking ahead in 2020, in addition to proposals related to recruitment and retention, we look to roll out the Victim Advocacy Program which will be huge in promoting and enhancing our agency's professionalism. We will also be implementing the Project Safe Neighborhoods Project, which is another federal grant the City of Wheeling has been identified to receive. This grant will fund a multi-phase project in partnership with the United States Attorney's Office to focus on gun violence and illegal gun possession. Part of this will involve a new program initiated by the WPD regarding what's known as a Crimestoppers Program. This program will enhance the quality and quantity of information through tipsters. We will also continue to seek ways to make our highways safer, particularly due to the large number of construction projects in the area.

I am again this year asking for an additional \$15,000 attached to the "Tech Ref and Services" line-item. This figure is based upon the recurrent costs associated with multiple programs. Some of these programs have been initially funded by the generous donation previously mentioned. Programs like our LiveScan system and mobile fingerprint scanners. These outstanding pieces of equipment have enhanced our efficiency and professionalism; however, they have annual associated costs for licensure and maintenance (\$4,500). The foundation donation provided us the startup of an electronic time reporting program. This program has an annual cost of roughly \$3,000. Our Leads Online program has an annual cost of \$4,200, a new FTO software program; an annual cost of \$1,200, our Police One training subscription has an annual cost of rough \$3,192. We will need in the coming year, additional licenses for our Records Management System (RMS). The addition of some new civilian staff (Victim Advocates) and use at a new Satellite office at Wheeling Hospital, each license is \$500 annually. These programs have improved our department in many ways and require these additional costs.

The only line-item outside of pay/benefits that I am asking for an increase in is the Grant Writers line-item. These two contracted positions have been worth their weight in gold. One position writes our grants and other handles the reporting on at least 5 grant programs. At midpoint of the current fiscal year, we are at 92% expenditure. I am asking for an additional \$3,000 for this line-item. This program has proven very valuable and should be maintained and funded for obvious reasons.

This budget proposal will contain five capital outlays, three that have appeared in my submission in years prior and two new ones. Many of our previous capital outlays have been or are in the planning phases of being funded by our foundation donation. This has been most helpful in purchasing equipment and programs. This year's capital outlay request includes the following:

- Wheeling Police Facility
- Take-Home Car Program
- Prisoner Transport Van
- Caliber Mobile 10 Software
- Police Drone

The police facility is not a new concept yet remains at the top of the priority list. Consideration must be given to not just the spatial and functional needs, but the intangibles that would come with the facility, which very well may improve some of our recruitment and retention problems.

The Take-Home Car program has been outlined previously and is more than just a recruitment and retention tool. This very clearly would involve some long-term cost savings and improve visibility and emergency response.

The prisoner transport van would be designated to transport multiple arrests at one time, provide safe transportation to and from the regional jail and court (when needed), and provide a safe transport for combative prisoners. This equipment would be valuable at our many large events when multiple arrests are a possibility.

The Caliber Mobile 10 software has become necessary due to necessary computer upgrades; our Premier MDT program will no longer be functional. As of January 2020, Microsoft no longer supports Windows 7 with security updates and it is recommended to upgrade to Windows 10. Windows 10 will not support the XP software and WPD officers will lose the ability to query vehicle and driver information on our Mobile Data Terminals. This creates a multitude of problems. The update with Microsoft would cost us roughly \$300,000; the proposed Caliber update will cost approximately \$127,000. Additional information will be included within this submission.

Finally, the WPD is proposing the purchase of a drone program. Currently CPL Jason Martin has been assigned the project of researching and pricing a quality drone program that would benefit the mission of the WPD. Since discussions of the drone acquisition, several incidents have occurred where the drone could have been put into use. Two recent missing persons cases, one involving a small child, proved to me the need for the ability to utilize a drone, particularly during the winter months. The drone could have easily been deployed to aid in the search for these persons and covered much more ground quickly. Many of our festivals, the ongoing construction project, and significant VIP visits to Wheeling all present opportunities to utilize this piece of equipment for enhanced and professional response. The approximate costs for this piece of equipment is \$35,000. Additional information will be included in this submission.

I am enclosing our Strategic Plan (Goals and Objectives), the Line-Item Budget Request Form, the Capital Outlay Schedule, the Program Justification Form, and other supporting documents. I am looking forward to meeting with you to examine and discuss our budget proposal further. Please do not hesitate to contact me should you have any questions or need additional information prior to our meeting.

Wheeling Police Department FY 2020-21 Budget Increase Justification

Proposed Increases

Personnel/Wages (Various Line-Items)

The Wheeling Police Department remains at 72 allocated sworn positions with one approved "over hire", totaling 73 sworn. Our civilian staff totals an allocated 13 (2 of which are part-time). With the recent Victim Advocate grant, we will increase our civilian staffing to 15. As of this submission, we have 66 sworn officers. Four of those 66 remain in various stages of training and are not technically contributing to our mission. This means we have 11 vacancies. We could accomplish much if those positions were all filled and functional.

As previously reported, we are no different than the nationwide trend. Fewer and fewer persons are interested in local law enforcement as a profession. As a city, WE are going to have to take measures to assure we continue to get the quality candidates we have and more of them. As a start, this budget submission contains a 5% proposed pay increase for police employees.

As we move through 2020, my intention is to propose a multi-faceted plan to improve monetary salary and benefits to police officers. This plan may involve exploring separate pay scales, skills proficiency type programs and other means of recognizing the work and skill sets of our police officers.

The "Take Home Car Program" is listed as a Capital Outlay and remains a very viable option to achieve not just recruitment and retention needs, but high visibility and response times.

It should be noted that our number of Sergeants should be changed to 15 from the 20 on the current budget. This number is currently at 17 and will get to the 15 number through specific attrition which was approved by City Council last year.

Finally, you will notice the addition of a Victim Advocate and Victim Specialist position to our personnel section. Both of these positions will be funded for 3 years by a federal grant we were awarded last October.

Tech Ref and Services (4700.20.2149)

This is one of two operational budget line-items that I am asking for a slight increase in. Each fiscal year, I am proud to say that the WPD comes in at or under budget. I am also proud to say that we have improved upon our additional funding sources by being awarded multiple grants and receiving a very generous donation for the past 2 years.

With the many tangible acquisitions that the grants and donations have brought us, this often involves subscriptions and/or maintenance costs. For this reason, I am asking for this increase for the many subscriptions, licenses and other costs, some of which are listed below:

 PlanIT Police Scheduling software 	(\$3,040 per year)
FTO Software Program	(\$1,200 per year)
• LiveScan System	(\$4,366 per year)
• InSynch RMS	(\$500 per license)
Police One Training	(\$3192 per year)

These are some of the recurring costs we will be facing in the coming years due to our purchase of these programs that have already paid for themselves by improving efficiency, accuracy and professionalism.

Specialization (4700.20.3160)

As mentioned previously throughout this submission, we have been very successful in acquiring grants and other funding sources. Particularly with the grants, I attribute this to the hiring of our crime analyst and our improved ability to utilize data. The other reason is the contracted grant writers we have brought in. We are currently budgeted at just over \$7,000 for these two persons (1 writer, 1 manager). Midway through this fiscal year, we are at 92% expended. I am requesting this line-item be increased by \$3,000 to cover the annual work done by these contracted employees.

Wheeling Police Department Releases 2019 Crime Statistics

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE January 28, 2020

The City of Wheeling remains a safe place to live as <u>major crimes continue to be on the downward trend</u>. In 2019, there were fewer serious crimes committed – a decreased by nearly 15% the last three years, according to statistics released by the Wheeling Police Department.

The specific crime data is divided into two areas – "Group A" offenses, which are generally more serious (murder, robbery, burglary, sex crimes), and "Group B" offenses, which involve more nuisance, quality of life, property crimes and highway safety/traffic offenses.

<u>"Group A" offenses (more serious crimes) were **down**, along with total calls for service. However, for the third straight year, <u>"Group B" (less serious crimes) were **up**, mostly because of increased directed patrols and focusing on specific issues and saturating high crime areas.</u></u>

The department continues to see, on average a 3% yearly decrease in its calls for service. However, the ongoing nationwide opioid epidemic continues to increase with overdose related calls and medical emergencies.


→ Group A (more serious offenses) <u>DECREASED by 6.5%</u>

Group A categories that <u>decreased</u> from the previous year were:

- Vandalism (down 22%)
- Burglary (down 10%)
- Robbery (down 33%)
- Drug Related Calls (down 27%)


Group A categories that increased significantly:

- Motor Vehicle Thefts by 24% (46 in 2019 vs. 37 in 2018)
- Assaults by **7%** (**577** in 2019 vs. **536** in 2018)



→ Group B (less serious offenses) INCREASED by 4%

Group B offenses increased slightly because of geographical policing and focusing on specific areas of crime in the city. Also, in 2019, officers continued to be visible and focus on impaired driving education. As a result, DUI arrests were down 15%.




→ Traffic Enforcement INCREASED by 3.7%

WPD continued its efforts to increase traffic enforcement throughout Wheeling in 2019, with a heavy emphasis on Interstate 70. Last year, there was a slight increase in crashes – mostly along I-70 in the fall months.



→ Drug Overdoses INCREASED by 14%

Drug-related overdoses have increased each of the last four years. In 2019, Overdose released deaths *decreased* for the first time in years – a total of 20% from 2018 to 2019. Overdoses were **NOT** just heroin related – but multiple types of narcotics. In addition to overdose calls, WPD responded to 85 medical calls to assist the Wheeling Fire Department.



*Note: Overdose death numbers can change after annual statistics are released because of pending cases with the state medical examiner's office.





RE : Purchase consideration of Caliber Mobile 10 Software

Background:

In early 2000 the Wheeling Police Department purchased a Motorola software product to allow officers to "run" drivers licenses and vehicle registrations from the MDT's. This product was called Premier MDT and operated on a Microsoft XP Operating System.

We are currently using Microsoft Windows 7 Professional, which still supports XP operating systems software. This software had an initial purchase cost and a yearly subscription to keep it up to date. Premier MDT is now called Premier One and the purchase price is \$300,000.

As of January 2020, Microsoft no longer supports Windows 7 with security updates and it is recommended to upgrade to Windows 10. Windows 10 will not support the XP software and our officers will lose the ability to have important driver and vehicle information at their disposal. All request would have to go through dispatch creating increased radio traffic.

<u>lssue:</u>

Without the ability to "run" driver and vehicle information from the vehicles, officer safety issues are created and efficiency is reduced by:

- Not knowing the status of a vehicle prior to initial approach (NCIC hits, stolen vehicles, license validity, etc.)
- Increased radio traffic to dispatch with driver/vehicle information request while another officer is attempting to relay information or request backup
- Officers cannot perform investigatory task (traffic stops, expired registration, etc.)
 on their own without waiting for dispatch to get to their request
- Waiting for dispatch to relay the information increases the officer's time on the side of the road
- Increased workload on the dispatcher who should be taking 911 calls

Proposed Solution:

After researching several vendors and products based on functionality and cost, I would recommend the acquisition of Caliber 10 Mobile.

Caliber is the software product currently being used by our 911 dispatch center for the CAD and requires the least transition and they have proven themselves in custom/technical support.

Caliber 10 Mobile is supported by newer Microsoft operating systems and already has an interface with the In-Synch files on our server. It can be installed on the MDT's in the cruiser as well as on a desktop machine.

In addition to providing the driver/vehicle information from licenses and registrations, it gives a past history of those that have previously been "run". This history is supported from over 700 agencies across the country currently using Mobile 10. When a vehicle is run and has an active NCIC hit, that information is sent to all other units currently logged on. This program can access DMV files to provide a driver's license photo or In-Synch file mugshot photo to aid in identification.

Pricing:

I have attached a previous quote from Caliber although it is a year old. There have been some price increases since then. Brad Thompson will be providing me with current figures soon. A fair estimation is an increase of just at or just under \$5,000 more than the attached quote shows.

The total price listed at the bottom of the page includes the first year subscription. After the first year, the subscription price will be under \$15,000 a year. The subscription includes all updates and technical support.

Chief I wanted to give you some insight on the drone and the equipment that I brought up to you the other day.



The Matrice M210 made by DJI - \$10,400 Dimensions unfolded - 28.2x8.7x9.3 inches

The DJI Matrice 210 gives the ability to carry two camera's at once unlike other models like the Matrice M200 that can only have one camera. This means that the drone would not have to land, have a camera changed out, and then take off again. This gives the ability to have a high powered optical zoom camera, and a thermal (FLIR) camera on the drone and ready to go at any time.

Batteries don't last long with drones even with the technology we have these days. The TB55 batteries have a flight time of approx 38 minutes. With the purchase of the 6 additional TB55 batteries and the battery charging-discharging station it would allow the drone to stay operational for a longer period of time. The drone would have to land, the batteries switched out, and that could repeat for as long as the mission lasts.

Other equipment needs may come up as training and missions evolve. For example if the drone is used for during a presidential visit, or at the Super 6 where a medical helicopter came in the FAA may require us to have radio communications with the aircraft in the area. If that were to come up then needing something like an air band radio can run from \$250-\$400.
