Multiple Wheeling firefighters responded to a house fire around 1:30 a.m. on May 2 in the city's North Wheeling neighborhood.

When firefighters arrived, flames were seen coming from the rear of 815 Market Street.

The occupants were able to escape after being alerted by a smoke alarm. One person received minor injuries and was taken to the hospital for treatment. A pet dog was unable to escape and sadly died.
