TREE TOPPING' CEREMONY

STATION IMPROVEMENTS

Structural upgrades took place this summer at two fire stations.

At Station 10, crews replaced a deteriorated portion of the truck floor and replaced the front apron/driveway entrance.

New concrete was poured at Station 2 for the truck floor and exterior apron. Work also was completed to secure the front and rear walls of the building.



SUMMER TRAINING

In early September, WFD personnel trained on new rescue equipment - the Paratech strut rescue system.

The struts can lift and stabilize anything from a passenger car to a school bus to a fully loaded semi-truck. The struts are also useful for trench rescue incidents and structure collapses.

Firefighters were able to test out the new equipment on an Ohio County school bus that was taken out of service and decommissioned.
