GROUND BROKEN ON NEW HQ



Wheeling Fire Department personnel, alongside City council, City administration and local leaders broke ground for the city's new fire headquarters on August 23.

The new facility, located at the corner of 17th and Wood Streets, will move the department from its current location in the bottom level of the Center Wheeling Parking Garage.

Construction is ongoing and the building is expected to be completed and occupied by late 2023.

SECOND ALARM FIRE

A second alarm fire caused multiple firefighters and nearby volunteer departments to respond to Jacob Street in East Wheeling on Saturday, August 13.



WFD's Bureau of Fire Investigations believe the origin of the fire started in the second-floor kitchen area of 1415 Jacob Street. The area sustained significant fire damage, making it challenging for investigators to make a further ruling. In all, five structures caught fire - two were considered a total loss and later demolished.

GENEROUS DONATION



WFD thanks Elmer Boroso for his donation of a Cardiac Transmission Modem to use on our ambulances. The donation is in memory of Elmer's wife, Beth, who passed away from cardiac arrest on April 6.

Elmer made the donation in hopes others will benefit from the devices lifesaving efforts for those experiencing cardiac related issues. The modem allows WFD to send an EKG to the hospital electronically while the patient is in the ambulance enroute to the Emergency Room.
